

## THE DAVE TURPIN TROPHY

The Dave Turpin Trophy is awarded annually at the Christmas Party and Awards Evening to a club member who has made a massive contribution to the club over the years (not just the last 12 months) in memory of one of our past members. Often this has been given for organising teams, administering club events like the Baildon Boundary Way race or social occasions, producing the club newsletter, increasing the profile of the club and too many other examples to mention. The trophy may only be awarded once to any recipient. Winners of the trophy are listed below.

2000	<b>John Rolfe-Dickinson</b> for organising several long distance relays such as the Dales Way, Coast to Coast and Pennine Way. John wrote much of the club newsletter and delivered paper copies of it by hand to one and all by hand; this was before the days of email! He also made a very eloquent and moving tribute to Dave Turpin at his funeral.
2001	<b>Dave Crane</b> for his involvement with team events, assisting with the Baildon Boundary Way including marking out the course and Thursday night route planning and announcing. Stepping into the breach to take over Tuesday night training.
2002	<b>Malcolm Sharp</b> for keeping the Sunday morning weekly runs going after the formal series of beginners' classes finished. He continued to encourage and advise the beginners and turned the Sunday morning meetings into a popular event, and was also instrumental in organising the Winter League by attending meetings and encouraging people to run.
2003	<b>Jane Dooley</b> for her marketing exploits in the recruitment side of the club. She actively promoted the club particularly on Sunday mornings when she would approach unattached runners and convince them of the merits of joining Baildon Runners.
2004	<b>John Cawley</b> for his contribution to the club over many years, but more recently having performed the duties of treasurer, newsletter producer, collator of race results, webmaster, entries secretary for the Baildon Boundary Way and responsible for email communications in the same period.
2005	<b>Eric Binns</b> for his contribution to the club over the past 8 years on the Committee, having served as club secretary and treasurer. The beginner training sessions were Eric's 'baby' and brought many new members to the club.
2006	<b>David Noble</b> for his contribution to the club in firmly establishing the Tuesday night sessions in the running week and greatly increasing the number of members regularly taking part.
2007	<b>Sue Coates</b> for her contribution to the club in always being there to encourage and cheer others on when she couldn't compete herself, for masterminding the resurrection of the Baildon Carnival Canter and being instrumental in introducing tracksuits, waterproof jackets and newly designed running vests.
2008	<b>Debra Kaznowski</b> for her contribution to the club over many years, in particular Debra organised all the social events such as the Dales trip and the Christmas party and raised funds for the club by way of the monthly lottery draw.
2009	<b>Quentin Lewis</b> for representing the club in races and performing at a very high level and encouraging others to join/raise their game. Top performer in Winter League for many seasons. Too many impressive performances to name.
2010	<b>Andrew Travis</b> for his work with the summer championship and the introduction of age grading, also for having taken on the unenviable task of administering the Baildon Boundary Way results each year.

2011	<b>Doreen Noble</b> for going beyond the call of duty despite not being in a position to run with us. For many years she held the dual roles of membership secretary and treasurer and kept the administrative cogs of the club running smoothly. She also plays a pivotal role in organising the Baildon Boundary Way and other events including the 'no watch' night and the Baildon Carnival Canter.
2012	<b>Geoff Perigo</b> for keeping the club running smoothly from organising Sunday morning sessions to sorting out away nights to Thursday night announcements, always being there to help with the Dales Trip, Christmas party, sending emails out and keeping the club website up to its excellent standard.
2013	<b>Ian Ferris</b> for his tireless work for the club for years; in particular his work with the beginners group on a Saturday morning where people with little or no experience of running are encouraged to stick at it and learn some very useful techniques, many such beginners have become confident enough to join our Tuesday and Thursday night training and go on to represent the club in many races.
2014	<b>Dave Lonsdale</b> for quietly making a massive contribution over a period of 5 years to the smooth running of the club as Treasurer and Membership Secretary. This latter role has been a very busy one with an increasing membership to register, a process run very efficiently and a credit to his dedication.
2015	<b>Alan Clements</b> for his service on the committee for several years and his work with the joint rugby/cricket club committee in negotiating a good deal for Baildon Runners. Also his willingness to open up the clubhouse and bar even when not running and his 'behind the scenes' work in connection with the Baildon Boundary Way.
2016	<b>Paul Baildon</b> for his contribution to the club over many years latterly as a committee member, club treasurer and organiser of club events such as the 'no watch' night and his quiet 'behind the scenes' work such as constructing the podium for the Olympics relay, preparing the field and tent for the Carnival Canter and single-handedly cooking the burgers at club barbecues.
2017	<b>Denise Johnson</b> for her support of all runners, her work with the Yorkshire Veterans' races, her devotion to OGOBS, the organisation of the club's summer handicap race and much more.
2018	<b>Linda Carey</b> for being a brilliant ambassador for the club in her unwavering support for everything going on, even turning up on crutches following a hip replacement operation, but particularly for taking on the role of Club Secretary a couple of years ago when no-one else had stepped into the role and for holding the club together magnificently ever since.
2019	<b>Jackie Walters</b> who, for nearly a decade, has given her time and energy to the club serving on the committee, organising rotas, acting as chief marshal in the Baildon Boundary Way, training to be one of our senior coaches, helping run the Saturday sessions and organising the trips to Europe.
2020	Not awarded due to the Coronavirus pandemic.
2021	<b>Elinor Newhouse</b> for her years of dedication to leading Group E on a Thursday night and for her long commitment to the Roberts Park Saturday morning training sessions. She offers support to new runners and is a role model to all.  <b>Joe Percival</b> for his service as a committee member, for improving the club technical and communications systems, for the successful Baildon Boundary Way in November 2020 in extremely challenging circumstances and for keeping the members safe during the pandemic in his role as Club Covid Coordinator.

2022	<b>Richard Lund</b> for organising lots of events, general enthusiasm and encouragement and support for all runners throughout the running calendar year, being fully committed and involved in all things, having a genuine passion for the club which manifests into many hours spent dealing with additional tasks alongside those that fall within his role of Membership Secretary.
2023	<b>Sarah Anderton</b> for putting in 100% effort and commitment for the club at every level, much work done behind the scenes. Takes part in all running competitions and social events. A good communicator and ambassador for Baildon Runners, leading the club by example.
2024	<b>James Wright</b> for working tirelessly for the Club, not only in pretty much single-handedly organising and administering the Summer Championships, but also as a dedicated run leader and all round fab runner. He works modestly and calmly to help the club on so many levels and has many ideas of where the club can progress moving forward. He is a very valued member of the Committee juggling family life and work commitments. He does all this with humour, dignity and respect.
